Surf Life Saving South Australia Call For Expressions of Interest

Jet Rescue Boat Crewpersons Rescue Water Craft Operators

Surf Life Saving SA is now calling for expressions of interest for qualified lifesavers to join some of it's specialist support services.

The state has obtained new Rescue Water Craft (RWC) jet skis, and is now looking to train a squad of lifesavers to form the initial group of operators.

There is also a call for interested persons to join the Jet Rescue Boat (JRB) service as trainees for the JRB Crewperson certificate.

Prerequisites for the RWC Operators Certificate are:

- Minimum 18 years of age
- Bronze Medallion
- Advanced Resuscitation Certificate
- Senior First Aid Certificate (SLSSA or other)

- Vehicle licence to operate tow vehicle
- Silver Medallion – Life Support*
- Silver Medallion – Patrol Captain*
- 400m swim in less than 8 minutes
- 1.6km run in less than 8 minutes

* = Applicants not holding these awards must be registered to attend courses run in August. Failure to complete these courses will disqualify applicant from RWC Service eligibility.

Prerequisites for the JRB Crewperson Certificate are:

- Minimum 16 years of age
- Bronze Medallion
- Advanced Resuscitation Certificate
- 400m swim in less than 8 minutes

Applicants for both services should remember that upon being accepted into the services, they will be placed onto a roster for regular weekend and public holiday patrols during the November-March season. Support Service patrols are generally from 10am to 6pm. This roster is in addition to club patrols, and all members must maintain their involvement at club level.

Regular training sessions and crew meetings are also held for trainees and operational members of both support services, which attendance will be expected.

Both services form part of SLSSA's 24 hour response group, and members may be called out to attend emergencies out of patrolling hours, including the April-October non patrolling season.

Brett Nankervis is more than happy to speak to anyone who would like to know more about the Jet Rescue Boat service.

Completed expressions of interest, endorsed by an officer of the Management Committee, are to be returned to Surf House by Friday the 18th of August.

Level 1 Surf Sports Officials Course

Another course is being run for people interested in undertaking the Level 1 Surf Sports Officials course, and becoming an official at carnivals.

The course is open to all registered financial members of a lifesaving club 15 years and older, and is to be held at Surf House on Wednesday the 12th of July.

Registration forms must be endorsed by the Management Committee, and returned to Surf House by THIS FRIDAY, the 30th of June.

Silver Medallion Courses

Patrol Captain Life Support

Surf Life Saving SA is running courses for suitably qualified lifesavers to gain one or both of two Silver Medallions- Being Patrol Captain and Life Support.

The first course is the Patrol Captain course, to be held at Surf House on Tuesday the 15th and 22nd of August.

Please Note:

This is a 8 hour course. Sessions will commence at 7pm on both days, and your attendance is required on both days.

The course will focus on objectives such as Responsibilities and Duties, Regulations (including local government), Management of Patrol and Public, Patrolling Methods, and Simulated Rescue Scenarios.

Prerequisites for the Silver Medallion: Patrol Captain are:

- Minimum 18 years of age
- Have held a Bronze Medallion
- Hold a CURRENT SLSSA award, such as Bronze Medallion or Radio Operator's Certificate or Advanced Resuscitation Certificate

The Management Committee encourages anyone who is interested in performing in the role of Patrol Captain to consider attending this course.

The second course is the Life Support course, to be held at Seacliff Surf Life Saving Club on Saturday the 28th of August, from 9am to approximately 4pm.

The course focuses on Making Decisions about Emergencies and Rescue Situations, Identify and Select Strategies, Identify and Solve Problems of Plans, Casualty Simulations.

Prerequisites for the Silver Medallion: Life Support are:

- Minimum 16 years of age
- Advanced Resuscitation Certificate
- Senior First Aid Certificate (SLSSA or other)

Registration forms for the Patrol Captain course are required to be returned to Surf House no later than 10am, Tuesday the 1st of August.

Registration forms for the Life Support course are required to be returned to Surf House no later than 12 noon, Friday the 11th of August.
