New Season Registration & Proficiencies

With the summer season fast approaching us, and with patrols starting on the beaches very shortly, it's time all our members made sure that they've re-registered for the new season.

By now you should have all received your membership renewal forms in the post. Membership forms need to be signed, both the front and the back of them, and any change of address or contact details recorded in the appropriate spaces.

This form can be returned to the club any Friday evening, or any Saturday afternoon between 1:30pm and 3:30pm. Forms should only be returned with membership payment (Social - \$20, Nipper - \$50, Patrols - \$65, Family - \$120, Associate/Gym - \$150).

Anyone who has not received their renewal form should speak to either Andrew Osborne or Greg Nankervis, or drop into the club during the above times.

Proficiencies this year are not going to be conducted on a designated "Proficiency Day", due to the lack of attendance at previous attempts to do so. This year each member will be undergoing their entire proficiency testing on their first rostered patrol. Members who wish to get their's over with before so are welcome to attend any other day's patrol and complete it with them.

Remember! Patrols start Saturday the 3rd of November. All patrol members rostered for that day must arrive at the club no later than 12:30pm to have the entire patrol setup on the beach prior to 1pm. The patrol roster will be distributed by the end of the week. Queries on the roster should be directed to Brett Nankervis – Captain of Lifesaving.

It is important that members read and understand these conditions. Hall Hires are an important part of the club financial planning for each year, and with our renovations, we have had a significant increase in the interest in hiring out our hall, including requests for wedding receptions. This is something that the club can not afford to loose, and each hall hire reduces the burden on the club (and in turn, you the members) to raise funds to fulfill our loan repayments.

Generally speaking, hall hires on a Saturday, entitles the hiree to use the space from 9am on the Saturday morning. This allows them to setup the hall as they please, and means that the hall **MUST** be neat, clean and tidy well before this time. This also means that club members are not permitted to enter the hall area itself, as the main hall entrance doors will remain locked.

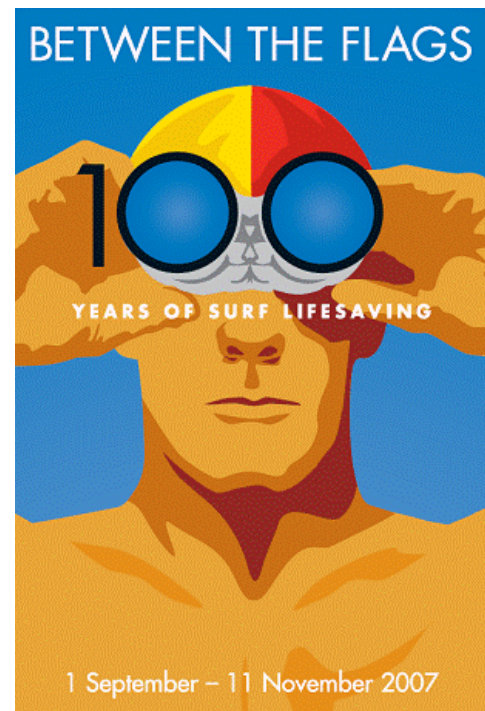
